Based on the 2005 British film Kinky Boots, the Broadway Musical with music and lyrics by Cyndi Lauper and book by Harvey Fierstein is inspired by true events and tells the story of Charlie Price.

Charlie suddenly inherits his father's shoe factory, which is on the verge of bankruptcy. He faces the decision of whether to pursue a new life in London with his fiancée Nicola or return to the town in which he grew up and save his father's dreams. Ultimately, Charlie decides to try to live up to his father's legacy and rescue the family business. In doing so, he finds unlikely inspiration in the form of Lola, a fabulous drag queen who needs some sturdy stiletto boots. Lola turns out to be the one person who can help Charlie become the man he's meant to be. As they work to turn the factory around, this unlikely pair find that they have more in common than they ever dreamed possible. With the door thrown open and the world at their feet, Charlie discovers that when you change your mind about someone, you can change your whole world.



"Then make something they do Want. Change the product!"



Did you know 'Kinky Boots' is inspired by a true story? But just how did a late 90s real-life factory dilemma become an international musical hit?

Before there was 'Kinky Boots' the musical, and 'Kinky Boots' the film, there was a 1999 BBC2 documentary 'Trouble at the Top' which launched the journey of this now iconic story.

The musical's protagonist, Charlie Price, is based on real-life Northamptonshire shoe factory owner, Steve Pateman. Steve had begun working in his dad's shoe factory, W. J. Brookes Shoe Company, East Barton, in 1979 and by

1993 was running the family business. By the late 1990s however, just like Charlie, Steve was faced with trying to save the factory when cheap imports threatened its survival; and its rescue didn't come in a chance encounter with a drag artist but in the form of an unexpected phone call, as Steve explains: "The factory was on the brink. Then I got a call from a lady called Sue Shepard. She was running a store down in Felixstowe, but was struggling with imports, and asked me if I would be able to make ladies shoes but in men's sizes. I thought it would be a small market, but Sue was waiting 6 – 9 months for delivery, and it all went off from there - not quite as dramatic as it is depicted in the musical!"

And so W.J. Brookes Shoe Company embarked on a new direction and launched a new range: Divine Footwear. It caught the attention of the BBC and in 1998 they began making a documentary, 'Trouble at the Top – The Kinky Boot Factory', before hitting the screens in 1999. Steve continues, "The programme followed me for 2 months making these boots and shoes and going to exhibitions and to see customers, as well as how I made them in the factory. Harbour Pictures saw the BBC production and reached out, explaining that they wanted my story to be the basis of their next British release."

Steve was a consultant on the

production, which was released in October 2005, even appearing in a cameo role. The character of Lola was created for the film, a "larger than life character" based on a number of people involved in the story from the beginning. Steve says: "Something I struggled to come to terms with is how Charlie is portrayed in the film. He isn't very clever, and Lola takes the credit for his, or my, creations. It is odd to watch."

The film sparked the development of the 2012 musical with music and lyrics by Cyndi Lauper and book by Harvey Fierstein and although Steve wasn't involved, he felt it was "great to see the story being kept alive in such a way". The musical made its Broadway premiere ten years ago in March 2013 and went on to win six Tony awards including Best Musical, Best Score and Best Actor for Billy Porter.

Steve has explored his story in a book, 'Boss in Boots', written alongside
Northampton-based author David Saint.

James Smith Charlie Price

Over the years James has been fortunate to play some fabulous leading roles at The City Hall with Manor Operatic Society in their annual pantomimes and midyear musical productions. Roles including, Caractacus Potts (Chitty Chitty Bang Bang) The Beast (Beauty & the Beast) Don Lockwood (Singing in the Rain) Tinman (The Wiz) and many more... but for now he says, "Let's make boots!"

Also, with Laffin Boi productions; his roles in adult versions of classic pantomimes include; Fairy (Cinderella) Genie (Not Disney's Aladdin) and Campy (Snow White). He has also music edited for 'Strictly Come Dancing' side show 'The Ballroom boys' starring Ian Waite, Vincent Simone and best friend James Lomas (the original West-End Billy Elliot). At EPDA Dance Academy he has taught Modern, Lyrical, Street and BBO Dance, also helping with choreography for their productions. Steven is part of duo 'Northern Vibes', singing for corporate events and clubs around the country. Claire has choreographed for many local productions. Credits include; (Carousel), (The Card), (The Likes of Us), (Annie), (Cabaret) all at the University Drama Studio. (Sweet Charity), (The King & I), (Billy), at the Montgomery Theatre. (Guys & Dolls), (Crucible awakes) Crucible. (Scrooge), (Oliver), (Our House), (Legally Blonde), (My Fair Lady), (Shrek) and (Sunshine on Leith) Lyceum. She has previously directed/choreographed for Handsworth & Hallam Theatre Co. and choreographed for many STOS Theatre Co productions. Claire directed/choreographed for Croft's (Priscilla Queen of the Desert) 2017, (Seven Brides for Seven Brothers) 2018, (Cats) 2019, (Funny Girl) which was unfortunately cancelled by the pandemic, and the highly acclaimed (Calendar Girls) 2022.



David Burgess Musical Director

David read Music at The University of Leeds (Bretton Hall Campus) before completing his teacher training qualifications at The University of Huddersfield. He is currently employed at RNN Group, Rotherham College and University Centre Rotherham as a Senior Curriculum Team Leader of Visual and Performing Arts. This role has enabled David to design and deliver creative curriculums alongside working with students ranging from Level 1 to Level 6. David also works closely with the University of Hull and Sheffield Hallam University writing higher education courses such as the new BA (Hons) in Music Performance and Production. He has been working as a performing musician and Musical Director for over 21 years. He performs regularly across Great Britain and Europe as the leader of the region's top party band, "The Magnetics Band". David works with numerous musical theatre and performance companies on many performance projects and we are delighted to welcome him back as our Musical Director after the success of (Priscilla Queen of the Desert) 2017, (Seven Brides for Seven Brothers) 2018, (Cats) 2019, (Funny Girl) 2020, (Calendar Girls) 2022, and now this year's Kinky Boots.



The Historical facts about Croft House:

'Croft House Settlement Musical and Dramatic Society' was originally founded in 1902 as part of the Croft House Settlement in Garden Street in the heart of Sheffield. The aim of the Settlement was to provide educational and recreational facilities for underprivileged children in the city. Various sections, including the Operatic Society, worked to raise money to support and help the running of the Settlement which still exists and operates in Garden Street. In the early years the society's first shows were performed there.

As the company grew and audiences widened, they had to move to the Temperance Hall - the site of the later Sheffield Playhouse. In 1920 the Cutler's Hall was booked for a performance of 'Merrie England' and the show was such a success the Company moved in 1921 to the Lyceum Theatre and this was their home for the next 10 years. From 1931 and then continuing after the Second World War most of the productions were held at the Empire Theatre until the theatre was sadly closed. The Society returned to the Sheffield Lyceum in 1960 but again our productions ended there when it also closed in 1969. Croft's 1970 production of 'Virginia' was held at The Montgomery Theatre; then from 1971 to 1990 'Croft House Amateur Operatic Society' (fondly called CHAOS) performed to their biggest audiences at the Sheffield City Hall.

For many years Croft, along with other theatre friends, had campaigned to get the now derelict Lyceum Theatre renovated by joining 'The Friends of the Lyceum Theatre'. The Lyceum Theatre was re-opened in 1990 with a "Grand Amateur Operatic Gala" on 14th December featuring Croft and three other top amateur companies in Sheffield in aid of the Lyceum Theatre Appeal. In March 1991 we were honoured to be the first amateur company to be invited back to perform at the newly refurbished LYCEUM. Many people thought the Lyceum would never be restored to its former glory, but its foundations have always remained strong. Our foundations were also well placed over 100 years ago and the traditions of the society still continue. Over the years our title name has shortened from its lengthy humble beginnings. In September 2010 we changed our name to 'Croft House Theatre Company' to represent the modern musical company we now are; but to all our patrons, members and friends we are just **CROFT.**


